Jennifer:

ML has called around 5 times. The last phone message was on Father's Day as you can see by the 2nd message I transcribed. The 2 below are verbatim messages off my machine.

"Your unethical and immoral behavior regarding the ponzi scheme that is the Bonita Bay Group is reprehensible. Believe me...all 7000 people who are affected know your name and know your phone number!! We don't like you!!! You screwed us! Assume that we have taken notice!"

"You should enjoy your Father's day (diabolical laughter). After all...a criminal investigation has been open! (forced giggle). By this time next year you'll be dealing with fraud, ponzi schemes, theft, grand larceny!! Oh what a tangled web you've weaved. Especially when we falsely claim to be an ethics expert!! Ha! Ponzi schemes are not ethical!!

He has also called California State University (2nd largest in the state, 35,000), and got through to the president after harassing the chain of command. He let them know they were dealing with a thief and a crook; that the money we gave to endow the Center for Ethical Leadership was money stolen from the residents of the Bonita Bay Group in a ponzi scheme.

He sent the university faculty, mostly from the College of Business Administration, the ponzi scheme email he has become famous for, with a cover note spelling out my high handed crimes. He continued to highlight the fact that I was the antithesis of the ethics center we started. He tried to call the local papers, but they blew him off and they called me instead to warn me.
